Day 1 – Sydney, Australia

Welcome to Australia, the sixth largest country in the world. It's about the same size as the 48 mainland states of the USA and 50 % larger than Europe, but has the lowest population density in the world - only two people per square km.

Australia is the only nation to govern an entire continent.

Australia's Aboriginal people were thought to have arrived here by boat from South East Asia during the last Ice Age, at least 50,000 years ago. At the time of European discovery and settlement, up to one million Aboriginal people lived across the continent as hunters and gatherers. They were scattered in 300 clans and spoke 250 languages and 700 dialects.



Upon arrival in Sydney you will meet with your Air-Cruise guide together with your other Air-Cruise traveling companions and enjoy an introductory dinner and tour briefing at the Bistro Lilly.

Day 2 – Sydney - Nadi

Our private jet awaits to fly us to Nandi to explore the Fijian Islands on the first leg of our amazing journey around the Pacific. For many the very name of Fiji conjures up the dream of a tropical island paradise that abounds with palm trees, waterfalls and blue lagoons.

Upon arrival you discover that the dream is, in fact, reality and that Fiji is truly a corner of paradise on earth. This unique archipelago in the South Pacific comprises of over 300 islands in over 18,000 square kilometers of this vast ocean. Only 100 hundred of these islands are inhabited but many hold the secrets of an untouched world of nature in all of its beauty.

Our destination is the main island of Viti Levu which is home to nearly 80% of the population, the capital city of Suva and the international airport at Nadi.

Day 3 – Discovering Fiji

After breakfast we will set off with our guide to explore some of Fiji's most exciting activity and cultural gems.

Our travels will take us into Nadi's scenic heartland through the beautiful Sabeto Valley to the Gardens of the Sleeping Giant, where you will discover the largest orchid collection in Fiji. Then to Viseisei Village, the legendary landing site of the first Fijians where you will be shown through the village and handicraft displays.

The Vuda Lookout affords a 360 degree bird's eye view of the West's mountain ranges, Nadi Bay, Nadi International Airport and the beautiful Yasawa Group of islands. Relax in a Fijian Bure and enjoy a tropical fruit juice and seasonal fruits from the orchard before returning to your hotel.



Day 4 – Nadi – Apia, Samoa

Today our private jet will take us to the North-East and to Apia, the capital city of Samoa. The country is located east of the international date line, south of the equator, and halfway between Hawaii and New Zealand in the Polynesian region of the Pacific Ocean.



Samoa is a postcard of natural beauty consisting of 10 islands, 2 large islands and 8 islets, and each offering very distinct and different environments to explore.

From the rainforest covered rugged volcanic mountain peaks of the two main islands to the vast valleys leading down to a coastline ringed with a necklace of white sandy beaches.

Within these lush green fertile valleys, grow banyan trees towering above the rainforest canopy which is full of tropical blooms and numerous varieties of vegetation.

Cascading waterfalls dropping into rivers that cut jagged lines through the valley floor as they make their way to the ocean.

The coastline is a wonder in itself, with sparkling white sand beaches, in some places stretching for miles, and here and there are walls of sheer cliffs that drop straight into the Pacific.



Beyond the beaches and out into the blue lagoons are scattered the rest of the islands that make up the Samoa archipelago, some inhabited, others with only nature's wildlife, protected by the fringing coral reef that keep the powerful force of the Pacific Ocean at bay.




Day 5 – Discovering Samoa

Our excursion today will give us insights into the ancient customs and traditions of the Samoan people and discover why people have been falling in love with the heart of Polynesia since the beginning of history. A land where unspoiled customs, cultures and courtesies still exist. Where visitors are welcomed as friends. Where natural beauty and a unique living culture are major attractions that you can enjoy.

Following the arrival of Europeans and missionaries, Samoa came to further prominence when Scottish author Robert Louis Stevenson fell in love with it and discovered his own "Treasure Island."

Stevenson's charming residence "Vailima" has been meticulously restored and is now a museum, the great author himself is buried atop Mount Vaea, overlooking Apia and its harbour. It's a resting



place he chose so he could stay forever with Samoa and the people he loved.

To conclude our tour we will observe a traditional Kava Ceremony.

Day 6 – Apia – Aitutaki

The Aitutaki Lagoon in the Cook Islands is one of the most beautiful island lagoons in the world, with its stunning coral reefs and small islets.

The islets are also called ' motu '.

Aitutaki is situated in the middle of the South Pacific Ocean with thousands of kilometers of open sea from any mainland or continent.

The lagoon has recently been made famous for another reason. Survivor Cook Islands was recently filmed there with all the publicity that came with it and visitors can take the opportunity of visiting the Aitutaki Survivor locations in the atoll.

Aitutaki has many attractions, including the magnificent lagoon itself and the small islands that border the lagoon. The scuba diving is also excellent with the fringing reefs having a great deal of coral and marine life and the coral sand beaches are second to none.

On arrival you will be greeted in true Aitutaki fashion and transferred to your Resort.

In the afternoon have some fun in the Aitutaki lagoon either tube riding, wake boarding or water skiing.

In the evening be ready to enjoy a performance of Cook Islands song, dance, fire dancing and more from the talented and dynamic local cultural group.




Day 8-Aitutaki-Tahiti

Sadly we must say goodbye to the beautiful Aitutaki this morning but later we will receive the warmest of welcomes when we reach our next destination of Tahiti.

More than just an international point of arrival for the other fabulous nearby islands, Papeete, the capital of Tahiti, offers visitors numerous treasures: the colorful market, art and history museums, botanical and flower gardens, animated nightlife and cultural exhibitions such as the traditional 'Heiva' which provides a lively change of scenery full of folklore, dancing, singing, colors and fragrances.

The Island of Tahiti is quite literally an existing legend...

Playing many roles, Tahiti is the largest, most populated and most glamorous tropical island of the 118 islands and atolls that comprise Tahiti Polynesia and of course the most famous - and



home to its unique capital city of Papeete. Sometimes called the Island of Love, Tahiti is shrouded in legend and the central character in many stories of travel, romance and intrigue.

Day 9 – Explore Papeete

Papeete has a daily market place open to the public for shopping and buying groceries.

This market, locally known as "Le Marche", is in a sense, the heart of the city. It has become a tourist and traveler's sightseeing favorite due to its brightly colored vendors and attractive Tahitian products. Wander among the many stands and displays to find such products as luscious ripe fruits and vegetables, monoi oils and scented soaps, vanilla beans, cakes and pies, fruit preserves, dancing costumes and clothing, woven hats and bags and shell necklaces.

2 floors worth of vendors, including the finest display of floral arrangements of orchids, marigolds and daisies and other flowers you will ever see.

After our visit to the market we can go in search of the famous Black Pearls of French Polynesia that are so famous and highly coveted. Well known for their superior quality and beauty, Tahiti and her surrounding islands are the leading black pearl exporters in the entire world.

Papeete is considered the Black Pearl capital of the world due to its many outlets for these shiny and round little Tahitian delights.



There is also a Black Pearl Museum where you can learn about the history, science, art and mythology surrounding the amazing Tahitian Black Pearls.

Day 10 – Tahiti - Sydney

Today we make our way back to Sydney to where this extraordinary journey began.
